Nurturing Minds' endowment campaign, Putting the Future in Her Hands, has set an overall goal of raising \$10 million which will give vulnerable Tanzanian girls in perpetuity a place to gain the education, life skills and confidence a girl needs to break the cycle of poverty, support herself financially and become a leader in her community.

By the time a girl graduates from SEGA she will know and be able to state her rights; have practiced assertive communication skills with the opposite sex; have opened a savings account; have developed a business plan and spent at least 100 hours in operating a small business; know how to use a computer and navigate the internet, have planted and maintained an organic garden; have given back to others, contributing her time to a local orphanage and home for the disabled and elderly; and have the necessary academic credentials and a continued education plan for her future.

The CHALLENGES

Only 30% of girls in Tanzania attend secondary school. Poverty forces many girls to drop out of school resulting in early marriage and teen pregnancy. Tanzania has one of the world's highest teenage marriage rates with 37% of girls marrying before the age of 18 (Girls Not Brides) and teen pregnancy rates with 121 births/1,000 girls age 15-19 (World Bank).

A poor Tanzanian girl faces tremendous barriers to success:

- School fees
- Sexual harassment
- Hunger and food insecurity
- Illness and lack of access to healthcare
- No electricity or running water
- Caring for siblings and sick relatives
- Housework



2007

- Attained 23 acres of land in Morogoro, Tanzania
- Formed the SEGA non-profit organization

2008

- 7 acres donated to SEGA by community
- Nurturing Minds received non-profit status in US
- First 30 girls enrolled at SEGA in borrowed classroom

2009

- First dormitory and classroom built on campus
- Well and water tower with a solar-powered pump constructed

2010

- 28 boarders and 30 day students began
- Installed first solar panels and batteries
- Second classroom block, a small solar-powered computer room & a dining pavilion built

2011

- A grant from USAID/ ASHA funds additional classrooms, dorms and staff houses
- School run businesses developed with Foundation Paraguaya provide training for students and school funding

2012


- 148 students boarding
- Launched our first school-run business, a poultry farm
- Installed a rainwater capture system


2013

- \$1 million grant by **USAID/ ASHA** for dorms, staff

2014

- Installed solar panels and batteries on new buildings
- 5 students attend first East African Girls' Leadership Summit in Kenya
- Career Development Program started with internships & scholarships for continuing education

















2015

- SEGA Lodge opened to house short-term volunteers & visitors
- SEGA was awarded the title of "Ashoka Changemaker School"
- The English Fluency Program started with 14 U.S. teachers and volunteers
- Study Abroad Program started to bring SEGA students to U.S. for 5 weeks

2016

- SEGA students reach 100% pass rate
- New Modern Girl Community
 Outreach Program in rural
 communities started to teach life
 skills in communities across
 Tanzania
- New Tourism Operations Program started to train girls in hospitality and generate income

2017

- The Community Outreach Program expands to reach 200 girls
- Kitchen renovated, second water cistern constructed and new solar panels and batteries installed
- Student-led newsletter launched highlighting life at SEGA through the students' eyes

2018

- 5 SEGA graduates are accepted into University
- The SEGA Lodge makes over \$30,000 in profit, bringing SEGA closer to its goal of self-sufficiency
- SEGA and Nurturing Minds celebrate 10 years of educating and empowering Tanzanian girls

2019

- First longitudinal impact study of SEGA graduates conducted
- The Modern Girl Community
 Outreach Program expands to reach
 450 girls
- Form 4 national exam results show 7 students receiving Division 1, the highest grade possible, and no students failing

2020

- Ranked in the top 7% of schools nationally
- Form 4 achieves highest national exam results to date despite a 3.5 month closure due to COVID, with 15 students receiving Division 1 and no students failing
- Successful implementation of COVID interventions, 100% of staff and students remained healthy

What does SUCCESS

AGNES

From teenage mother to business woman

Agnes' story is one of challenge and triumph. With a scholarship from The Foundation For Tomorrow, she attended a school in Arusha. She was 16 at the time and had no knowledge of English, the language used for all secondary school classes. Her first year was marked with the hurdles of English comprehension and difficulties in her classwork. Adding to Agnes' challenges was that she became pregnant.

The Foundation for Tomorrow approached SEGA about Agnes' dilemma and she was accepted to SEGA post-pregnancy. Agnes took advantage of all SEGA had to offer in academics and entrepreneurship and took particular interest in the Business Club. She graduated from SEGA and pursued a vocational track where she trained in tailoring and beading skills.

Today, Agnes has a thriving tailoring business that creates hand bags that are sold throughout Arusha. She has been successful in securing steady streams of business. Agnes has diversified her skill set, trains and employs others, and has grown her business through the addition of new sewing machines, designs, and products. She has been able to build a house for her daughter and herself, and is a well-respected member of her community.



NUSURA From drop out to African leader

Nusura Gundi's mom died in 2003 of typhoid leaving her care to her father, a farmer with a second wife and other children to care for, and her grandmother. They could not afford the fees to send her to school. Luckily Nusura's grandma heard about SEGA, encouraged her to apply, and she was accepted.

Academically, SEGA was challenging for Nusura. She studied hard and her perseverance and positive attitude paid off. Nusura graduated from SEGA in 2015 and was one of only five students from Tanzania (and 125 from the entire African continent) accepted into the prestigious African Leadership Academy (ALA) in South Africa. ALA identifies young people with leadership potential, and entrepreneurial spirit with a record of community service and cultivates these leaders throughout their lives into university and beyond.

Nusura currently attends the African Leadership University (ALU) in Rwanda.

Naming Opportunities ON THE SEGA GIRLS' SCHOOL CAMPUS



By endowing one or more student scholarships, you can see the immediate benefits your endowment gift has in providing assistance for a quality education and a pathway out of poverty. Each \$50,000 gift provides a full scholarship to a student each year and each \$15,000 gift provides a partial scholarship to a student each year, in perpetuity.

You will be connected with a student to follow her progress while at SEGA.

There are two levels of endowed scholarships:

TREE OF KNOWLEDGE

\$50,000 or more over 5 years 5% return will provide \$2,500/year

You are the sole sponsor of a student. Your support covers the full cost of educating a girl.

SCHOLARSHIP LEVEL

\$15,000 or more over 5 years 5% return will provide \$750/year

At this level, there are up to four sponsors per student.

At both levels you receive

- A personalized connection with a student
- Student biography and photo
- Academic updates twice a year
- At least 2 letters annually from your student


